Wintertide Festival will once again be burning brightly on Hartlepool's Headland from Friday the 21st to Sunday the 23rd of November, with a packed programme of art, music and performances along with workshops and an independent maker's market.

One of the only grassroots residential festivals in the Tees Valley, Wintertide hosts an artistic programme that reflects and celebrates Hartlepool, its people, places, passions, heritage, and folklore. Wintertide's aim is to bring the historic streets of the Headland to life, which it achieves by welcoming over 15,000 people to the area every other year in this biennial festival of arts and culture.

Through our innovative and community-led events, we transform the Headland into a space for curiosity and creative exploration, ensuring that people across the region can access and enjoy the strong cultural offerings Hartlepool has to offer, and creating a legacy for arts in the region.

This year's Wintertide Festival begins on Friday 21st November with a vast and vibrant community parade, a glowing constellation of light, music, and movement, inspired by ancient myths, celestial journeys, and dreams of the stars. This bleeds into our wider art trail, a collection of illuminated work from across the region, scattered across the Headland. Make a wish among the stars with Periplum's 'Spiral Galaxy' fire installation, and awe at our centrepiece, a stunning, sparkling nova by Studio Vertigo. All of this will be surrounded by exhibitions, performances and creative workshops for all, flooding Hartlepool with bright lights and life in the depths of winter.

The Nova sculpture is based on the mystical Star of the East, which astronomers now believe was actually a nova. As a spectator, you will feel like you are experiencing a nova or "new" star - mighty and dazzling.

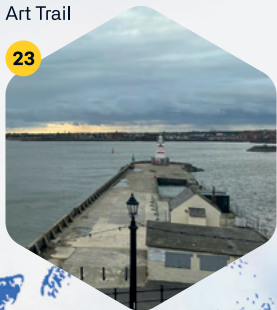

The Closing Concert

Hartlepool's most creative weekend is gearing up to go out with a bang, and music lovers should clear their diaries for a captivating night at St. Hilda's Church, The Wintertide Closing Concert isn't just the last note of a packed festival weekend; it's an awe-inspiring night that brings together headline performers, the region's brightest talent, and a historic setting that's left past audiences stunned.

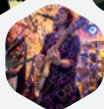
Headlining the evening are Field Music, a jewel in the North East's musical crown. Formed by brothers Peter and David Brewis, this Sunderland indie-rock band have been Mercury Prize nominees and are known for their clever, genre-blending sound and thoughtful lyrics. Field Music's back catalogue spans nearly twenty years, and 2025 is a special year for them as they mark the 20th anniversary of their self-titled debut with an album reissue, along with unreleased recordings from the band's formative years, brand new liner notes from former NME writer James Snodgrass, and archive material from the North East music milieu which gave birth to Field Music, The Futureheads, Maximo Park and more.

Support comes from The Memory Club, an indie-folk collective from Manchester. Hartlepool served as the first stop on The Memory Club's debut summer UK tour last year. Since then the band have played shows alongside The Ocelots, SG Goodman and performed at this year's Victorious Festival (on a lineup with Kings Of Leon, Travis and Queens of the Stone Age).

Opening the evening are Mercedes, who fly the flag for grassroots music in Hartlepool. This female-fronted indie rock band is pure hometown pride. Locals will know Mercedes for their commanding vocals, catchy choruses, and commitment to the Hartlepool music scene—making them the perfect pick to set the tone and welcome audiences home before the national headliners take the stage.

This night is more than a grand finale of the weekend; it serves as a marker for the Festival's legacy, gearing up for a new generation of music programme producers for the next edition. The Festival's new Youth Producers Programme, in partnership with Youth Music, is a series designed to give people aged 16 to 25 their first steps into a career in music through free training, paid work experience and time with industry experts, culminating in the chance to shape the sounds of the next Wintertide Festival in 2027.

Throughout the weekend, Hartlepool's Headland will be buzzing with live music in pubs, street performances, and workshops, ahead of the Closing Concert.

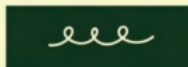
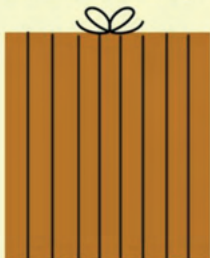
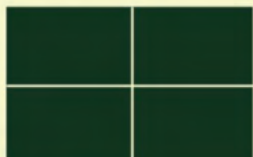

Victoria M Sheader Art, is the painter of expressive paintings and prints inspired by colour, form, and emotion.

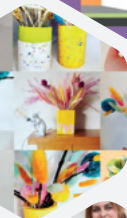

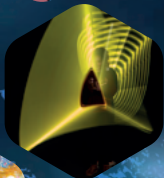


**Hartlepool's

The 12° North Project placed artists within Hartlepool's 12 wards, to co-create inclusive, imaginative activities shaped by residents' interests and lived experiences. This year's theme 'Constellations' was inspired by this project, a reflection of light, creativity, community and unity. Just as stars form patterns in the night sky, Wintertide Festival seeks to illuminate the power of connection: between people, places and stories. This is a collection of so many amazing projects rolled into one, so here's just a taster.

Art Trail



The Art Trail: 12° North Project

Amanda Smith

Artist Amanda Smith and residents from the Headland created illuminated artworks inspired by Viking myth and the night skies that once guided their voyages. A reimagining of the constellations as seen through Norse eyes, blending legend, light and local history. Drawing on the story of King Eystein's final raid on Hartlepool in 1153 AD, a tale etched in ancient sagas and carried on northern winds.

Sarah Harris

Doodlers and Dreamers: A Community Light Artwork. Created by the imaginations of Hartlepool's doodlers and dreamers, this radiant installation brings together artwork from people of all ages who answered our open call to celebrate the zodiac through light and creativity. Each glowing piece began as a simple drawing, a personal take on a star sign, transformed into a shimmering constellation within this collective light artwork. From bold graphics to delicate linework, every design reflects the individuality, imagination and community spirit that make Wintertide shine.

Aria Art & Movement

A unique workshop series combining stars gazing excursions, movement, aerial performance, creative writing and making; inspired by stars, space, and community connection, Artist Sarah Dobbs worked with teenagers to develop 'The Star Makers' performance. Themes of light, orbit, and constellation will come together as part of an arial performance, Sunday 23rd 6.30pm.

Where Hope Shines

Where Hope Shines is a creative exploration of emotion and light, where students transformed words such as love, compassion, hope, and gratitude into luminous works of art. Drawing inspiration from constellations, the project celebrates how these universal feelings connect us — just as stars connect across the night sky. Each piece reflects a personal interpretation of kindness and positivity, reminding us that even in darkness, light always finds a way to shine through.

Wintertide Festival continues its reputation for incredible live and loud music with an evening dedicated to some of the most talented artists around. Join us for an evening at Headland Social Club with Leaders of Men, Perfect Chicken, Moss, Marawders, and Lurcher.

Clad in balaclavas, a band is emerging. It is not a punk band, not a rock band, not progressive nor pioneering. They are Perfect Chicken. This is the dawn of regressive rock. No, not progressive rock. Standing as the ultimate antithesis to bands like Pink Floyd and King Crimson and especially out to oppose the legacy of Genesis, regressive rock spits in its face and offers up a complete flip side to its so-called 'adventurous' or 'epic' sounds.

Moss are an electronic duo from the north of England, operating mainly in the realms of the Trip Hop genre. The band was born in 2023 and has quickly gained respect from their peers on the North East electronic music scene.

Marawders are a three-fronted, four-piece rock band. They play covers from artists such as Saxon, Judas Priest, UFO, ACDC, Motorhead, Iron Maiden, Metallica, Ozzy Osbourne, Van Halen and many more.

Lurcher is a four-piece post-punk band blending tones of 70's abrasive punk and art rock with witty lyricism. They've recently been the focus of spotlight pieces with RTE and NARC magazine, reflecting the landscape of Hartlepool in their sound.
